We kicked off the year with a **Pōwhiri**, where our students represented Rodney College with mana and confidence. It set the tone for a year built on respect, community, and ambition. A special thank you to the Rodney community for welcoming my family, along with other new staff and students, so warmly.

Attendance Matters – Every Day Counts

A strong start to the year also means setting high expectations for **attendance and punctuality**. Research consistently shows that attendance is one of the biggest factors in student success, and we are committed to ensuring students are in class, on time, and ready to learn.

Missing just **one day a fortnight** adds up to **four weeks of lost learning** over a year.

Students who attend school less than 90% of the time fall behind academically, struggle with consistency, and miss out on key moments that shape their education.

Rodney College is aligned with the government's **Every Day Matters** initiative, which focuses on improving attendance nationwide. You can read more about this strategy <u>here</u>.

For students needing extra support, we are implementing the **Stepped Attendance Response (STAR)** framework, providing structured intervention and family support where necessary. More information on chronic absence and government strategies can be found in this **ERO report**.

To support a focused learning environment, students must keep phones off and in their bags during the school day, and vaping is strictly prohibited on school grounds

Building Momentum

The year is off to a busy start, and it's been fantastic to see students engaged across academics, sports, and cultural activities:

- Athletics & Swimming Sports Both events showcased House competition at its best, with students pushing themselves and achieving personal bests. A new school record was broken at athletics in the Relay, which is always exciting. The student council, led by our Head Students and supported by Year 13, ensured both events ran smoothly.
- **30 students** spent 3 days last week working with Waka Kotahi preparing for their Learner Licence, a key milestone for independence and future opportunities.

- Our **Year 12 Te Reo students** are working with Matua Wiremu on developing a College Karakia, further strengthening our school identity.
- **Boxing Mentoring with Springboard** offering students a chance for personal growth, discipline, and goal-setting. We'd like to acknowledge Springboard's support in making this happen again in 2025.

- 6. Select the reviewer type.
- 7. Enter your name (optional).
- 8. Follow the prompts to show that you've read the topic and enter your feedback if you'd like to comment.
- 9. Agree to the privacy statement and click "Submit review".
