We look forward to formally welcoming Laurence and his whānau into our Rodney College community next year.

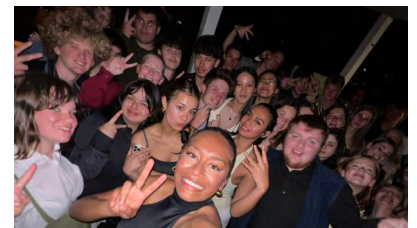

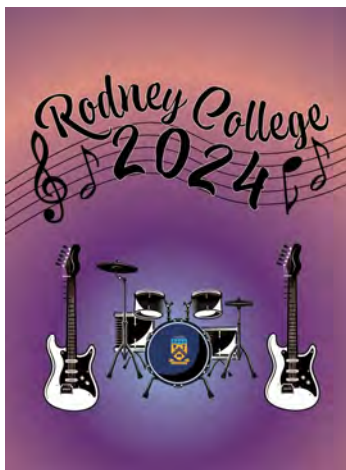

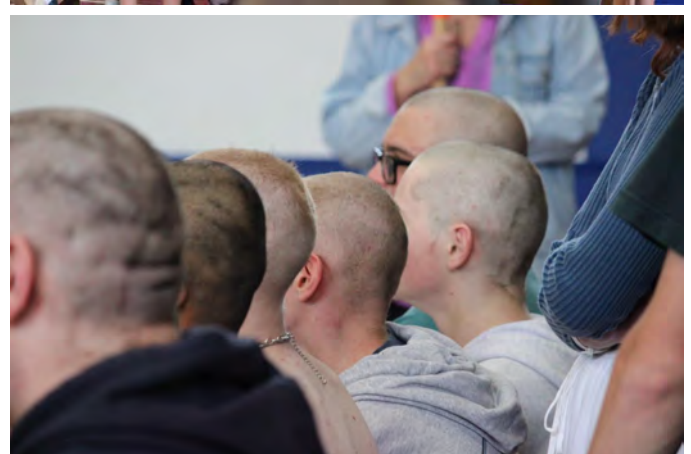
SHAVE FOR A CURE

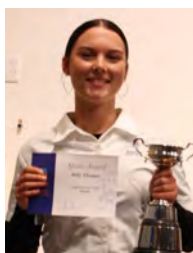

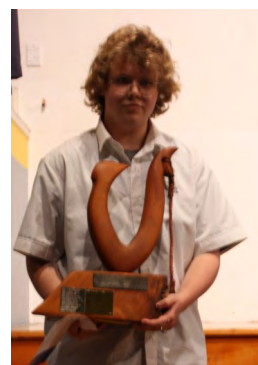
